Nuestros padres comieron el maná en el desierto, como está escrito: “Pan del cielo les dio a comer.” Jesús les replicó: «En verdad, en verdad os digo: no fue Moisés quien os dio pan del cielo, sino que es mi Padre el que os da el verdadero pan del cielo.
